

#### **HEAT-RELATED DISORDERS**

Heat stroke occurs when the body no longer sweats and body temperature reaches dangerous levels. Symptoms of heat stroke include:

- · Dry, hot reddish skin and lack of sweating
- High body temperature
- · Strong, rapid pulse
- Chills
- Confusion
- · Slurred speech

Heat exhaustion is the body's response to the loss of water and salt, typically through sweating. Symptoms of heat exhaustion include:

- Excessive sweating
- · Weakness or fatigue
- · Dizziness and/or confusion
- Clammy skin
- Muscle cramps

Usually on neck and upper chest, groin area, under the breasts, and in elbow creases.

#### **TEN HOT WEATHER SAFETY TIPS:**

- 1. **Stay hydrated**. Drink plenty of fluids; drink about 16 ounces before starting and 5 to 7 ounces every 15 or 20 minutes.
- 2. **Avoid dehydrating liquids.** Alcohol, coffee, tea and caffeinated soft drinks can hurt more than help.
- 3. **Wear protective clothing.** Lightweight, light-colored and loose-fitting clothing helps protect against heat. Change clothing if it gets completely saturated.
- 4. Pace yourself. Slow down and work at an even pace. Know your own limits and ability to work safely in heat.
- 5. **Schedule frequent breaks.** Take time for rest periods and water breaks in a shaded or air conditioned area.
- 6. Use a damp rag. Wipe your face or put it around your neck.
- 7. Avoid getting sunburn. Use sunscreen and wear a hat if working outside.
- 8. **Be alert to signs of heat-related illness.** Know what to look for and check on other workers that might be at high risk.
- 9. Avoid direct sun. Find shade or block out the sun, if possible.
- Eat smaller meals. Eat fruits high in fiber and natural juice. Avoid high protein foods.

### **President's Message**

Hello Leisureville Residents and Homeowners.

We are still under restrictions resulting from the Coronavirus, but the Association continues to operate, and it has been a busy month. The Board continued with normal operations, including home sales and rental approvals, Architectural Modifications approvals and Board meetings. The Board held its monthly meeting using ZOOM on June 1st. ZOOM meetings have become exceedingly popular with 117 devices logged on. Many people were watching and taking part in the meeting live. The meeting went quite well, and a lot of business was conducted. The Association's insurance coverage was ratified at a cost of \$61,806. Coverage includes: Property, General Liability and Crime, Directors and Officers, Workers Compensation, and an umbrella policy. The Board also approved a contract with Miami Pool Tech to maintain chemical levels in the pool on weekends. This service is required by State law and the County. The Board also ratified two emergency contacts with Kilbourne for a sinkhole repair on Roma Way and a broken pipe in the roadway on Sixteenth Street.

Budget season is upon us. John Mainville is forming a Budget Committee and will work with the Board and FirstService to develop the best budget for Leisureville. We have already saved considerable amounts on the weed control and the pump maintenance contracts. We will continue to examine cost centers for savings.

The Board also voted unanimously to open the pool on June 8, under CDC and Palm Beach County requirements. Gina, Avis and all the staff, worked extremely hard to make the pool available to residents under the current conditions. So far, with the cooperation of residents, it has gone very well. All necessary supplies for opening the facilities are on hand and a Plexiglas shield has been installed on the office window. All available precautions are being considered. We are all looking forward to the next phase.

I know we are still in the pandemic, but now it is hurricane season. Please trim your trees and remove coconuts from your palm trees. It is in consideration for your neighbors that you secure everything that could become a missile in the storm. Checklists for hurricane preparedness are available. If you need help, call the office. The staff has started to prepare the facilities for the storm season.

We, as a community, are facing a great many challenges. The Coronavirus has made life more difficult, creating anxiety among our residents. And now, we are facing our storm season with the usual problems. I hope everyone is well supplied and has made arrangements for storm preparation.

Now, more than ever, we must be united as a community. Get to know your neighbors and form contact lists. We have been physically isolated for many months, but we must remain a community in the times ahead. We should be in a position where we can aid neighbors.

The Board of Directors has been working with staff to maintain operations during these times. We wish everyone a happy and safe summer.

While many cities have given standing ovations to first responders and health-care professionals, who have been pressed into working long hours, some working and staying on the job to the point of exhaustion. Franklin's famous statement was made in 1776, referring to the need for the signers of the Declaration of Independence to stick together against a common enemy, Great Britain. Franklin's words are just as true today, 244 years later, which can be applied today, as we all face the common enemy of this pandemic.



None of us ever expected anything close to this would happen at our late hour of our age, but together we will get through it. We will slowly return to life after this long shutdown, hopefully with a heightened awareness of how powerful this invisible virus can be on all our us.

### STROKE

Several people have sent this around via e-mail. Being such a common concern among most of us, this is a condensed version of those messages.

These are '3' (three) helpful ways to recognize a STROKE.

S — Ask the individual to smile.

T — Ask the individual to SPEAK a simple sentence.

R — Ask the person to raise his or her arms.

(An added item is to ask the person to STICK OUT his or her TONGUE). If it appears to be crooked, this can be another warning sign.

Getting medical help for the victim can usually reverse the damage of the STROKE. So, act promptly, call 911.

Hope all is well and see you next time.



In 1880 ... who sold them? Where would you go to get one? A store? No ... try the train station.



Our story happened only because it was all arranged by "Richard," on duty at the North Redwood, Minnesota railroad station. It happened that one day a huge crate of watches arrived from the East. No one ever came to claim them.

Richard dutifully sent a telegram to the manufacturer. They didn't want to pay the freight back, so they asked if Richard could sell them. Richard immediately sent a wire to every agent in the system asking if they wanted a good, cheap pocket watch. Sold out in two days ... with a handsome profit.

That started it all. Richard ordered more. He asked all the other operators to set up a display case in each station offering high quality watches at a cheap price to all travelers. Soon, many were traveling to the train station to buy their watches. They sold more watches than any store.



Richard left the train station and he and his partner, Alvah, moved their company to Chicago. It's still there today.

The biggest watch retailer in the country had its beginnings in the North Redwood, Minnesota, railroad station ... telegraph operator "Richard Sears" and his partner, "Alvah Roebuck."







#### YELLOW DOT

For several years, we have had a program available to us called "Do the Dot." This program is very similar to the "Vial of Life."

The purpose is to provide information to the emergency crew when you are involved in an incident, allowing them to be aware of your medical status

You would receive a packet with a guide for you to provide the necessary information and place this in the glove box of your car. Emergency personnel would be aware to look, when they recognize the yellow dot placed on the drivers' side of the rear window of your car.


This lifesaving information can help rescue crews decide how to treat appropriately. This is especially important after a car accident where you may be unconscious, in shock or simply unable to communicate clearly.

#### YOU CAN IMPROVE YOUR MEMORY!

The concept that people become forgetful and set in their ways as they grow older is a self-fulfilling prophecy. In reality, studies have shown that many people have become more tolerant, more open-minded and have better memories as they grow older!

Your memory is your private library to file info, thoughts and feelings. You can retrieve this information at will. Your memory works from the beginning of your life — first in an unconscious learning process, then in conscious ones. YES, YOU CAN HAVE A BETTER MEMORY! Start NOW to use MIND CONTROL for MEMORY IMPROVEMENT. Here are some simple, effective techniques to practice for quick memory retention!

Many of us have tried tying a string around our finger to help remember something. How many times have you forgotten why the string was there? A more effective technique I have discovered, is to turn your ring around the opposite way. As you do, mentally repeat your memory, such as, "Buy the Vitamin C," or "Call Mother." When you physically feel and see the ring on backwards, your mind will trigger to recall.

To remember a name, associate the name with appropriate words. Example, "Joy" can be under the category of HAPPINESS. "Mr. Marlin" will remind you of a fish. Conjure up an image of a fish. When you meet someone for the first time, repeat their name after the introduction, then use it again in a sentence. Many times, we never hear the name to begin with. We need to get the facts, so make sure you get the proper name.

In learning while reading, stop occasionally to review what you have read. Go over the entire material to get the complete picture, then go back and review part by part. BEFORE you begin your study, take a slow, gentle breath as you inhale, and think, "RELAX." As you exhale, think, "RETAIN." ### COVID-19 and Child and Infant CPR

If a child or an infant's heart stops and you're worried that they may have COVID-19, you can still help.



# Step 1

Make sure the scene is safe.

Check to see if the child or infant is awake and breathing normally.



# Step 2

Shout for help.

If you're alone, phone 9-1-1 from a cell phone, perform **CPR with 30 compressions** and then 2 breaths (if you're willing and able) for 5 cycles, and get an AED.

If help is available, phone 9-1-1. Send someone to get an AED while you start CPR.

# Step 3

Provide CPR with compressions and breaths (if you're willing and able).



#### ■ Start child CPR

Push on the middle of the chest 30 times at a depth of 2 inches with 1 or 2 hands.

Provide 30 compressions and then 2 breaths. Repeat cycles.



#### Start infant CPR

Push on the middle of the chest 30 times at a depth of 1½ inches with 2 fingers.

Provide 30 compressions and then 2 breaths. Repeat cycles.

Use the AED as soon as it arrives. Continue CPR until EMS arrives.




